Appointments

Each new family is asked to contact the College Uniform Shop on (08) 6330 0250 to make an appointment to purchase their daughter's uniform. All new parents must make an appointment.

Appointments allow for individual service so that the fitting of the uniform is a pleasant experience. Each appointment may take approximately 30 - 45 minutes.

All uniform items (including black shoes) are available at the College Uniform Shop. Students may come and purchase without a parent. Care is taken to fit the student correctly.

Returns

Garments may be returned/exchanged if they are complete with swing tags and receipt, and if they have not been worn, altered or laundered.

Payment

Personal Presentation

The uniform is a sign of identity with the college and should be worn with pride. Each student is expected to be properly attired in full uniform while at the college, when travelling to and from the college, and when representing the College at external functions and events.

Students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance, to be neatly attired and to be well groomed.

Personal presentation rules

- The College blazer is always worn as the outer garment to and from school.
- Shirts are to be worn tucked in.
- Uniform dresses and skirts are to be knee-length.
- The school jumper can be worn with dresses and skirts while at school.
- Hair that is collar-length or longer must be tied back and confined in one or two ponytails.
- Hair that is obviously streaked, tinted or dyed, or which is a colour not natural to the student, is not acceptable.
- Extreme and untidy hairstyles are not permitted.
- Hair accessories are to be plain and to be the College colours of red, white or bottle green.
- Coloured nail polish, make-up, and artificial nails and eyelashes are not permitted.

Jewellery

Accessories are restricted to a wristwatch, a simple ring, a Christian symbol on a neck chain and an approved silicone wristband.

Students may wear one small sleeper or small stud in the bottom of the lobe of each ear:

- Sleepers – should be no larger than 12 mm in diameter
- Studs – 5 mm diameter.

Ring, necklaces and studs or sleepers are to be gold or silver and are not to be embellished with gems or coloured/stone beads.

Stockings

In Terms 2 and 3, students are expected to wear opaque black tights. Student Reception and the College uniform shop keep a supply of stockings which can be purchased throughout the day. If a student's stockings are laddered or have holes in them, the student will be asked to purchase a new pair. Keeping a spare pair of stockings in the student's bag is recommended.

Students in Years 5 and 6 may wear socks during Terms 2 and 3.

Casual dress days

On casual dress days, students are required to dress in accordance with the College's published standards in order to participate in the day's program and activities. The College's expectations for such occasions are published in the daily notices before the event.

Excursions

Students would normally be expected to wear their full school uniform on excursions. However, should there be a need for students to wear the sport uniform, they will be advised by the coordinating staff.

Special-purpose camps

These involve students leaving on a school day for a camp. Students are expected to wear normal uniform and change into suitable casual clothes before going. Uniforms can be left at school.

Whole-year camps

Students can come to school in specified clothing or suitable casual clothes advised by co-ordinating staff.

- White College socks (Years 5 and 6)

Sport uniform

- College tracksuit jacket
- College tracksuit pants
- House polo shirt
- White College polo shirt
- Red College shorts
- College hat
- College sport cap (Years 7 - 12) (compulsory for all outdoor activities)
- College bucket cap (Years 5 and 6) (compulsory for all outdoor activities)
- College sport socks
- Black College bathers
- Black rashie
- House swimming cap
- Sport shoes (predominantly white is preferable)
- College sport bag

Music uniform

- College black trousers
- College black blouse with red piping

Other

- College scarf (red)
- College athletics/cross country outfit
- College netball/hockey skirt
- Red, white or green hair accessories
- College library bag (Years 5 and 6)
- College school bag (all years)

Please note:

- All clothes are to be clearly labelled with the student's name, not initials, and house on them.
- All bags are to have students' names on them and a tag to make them easily identifiable.
- Name labels and tags can be purchased at the uniform shop.
- Students who do not follow the College uniform policy risk being given an after-school detention.



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
